Elimu's Artisan Maker Space is transforming young women in rural Kenya from just sewing in their villages to becoming players in the fashion and design industry locally and beyond. In October, we launched a new training program for our alumni. They will be gaining new skills and ideas including how to produce garments and crafts from recycled waste materials. The products will open up new markets for them and improve their income generating potential.

ELIMU DOCUMENTARY: PENDO! - THE RAGDOLLS THAT TELL GIRLS' STORIES

At the outset of COVID-19 with the sewing college closed, Elimu came up with the idea to bring our sewing students back to their college for business activities. It started with sewing face masks and evolved into an exciting artisan ragdoll project. The dolls are truly Kenyan but with lots of collaboration from around the world.

Earlier this year, with the help of an Ottawa Algonquin College broadcasting intern, we produced Elimu's first-ever documentary to tell the story. It claimed second place at the Grand International Film & Theatre Festival (Nairobi).



Sewing skills changed her status and made her a provider. She proudly owns livestock.




JOSEPH From out-of-school to top of class!

TRANSFERRING DIGITAL SKILLS TO THE COMMUNITY

Elimu's Cisco Networking Academy is housed inside Elimu Resource Centre in Malindi. Established in September 2019, our first graduation event included only 15 graduates. Last year was our first full year of operation as an academy.

Despite the challenges of the global pandemic, we were able to assist 50 youth (15 females / 35 males) with digital skills.

More than half used their internationally recognized certificates to find work or improve their professional skills and one started his own business. Many continued on to further studies in the technology fields.

Meet Debora - when she discovered Elimu Resource Centre in high school, she dove in! She found solutions to so many of her challenges. The conducive youth-friendly study environment made study time fruitful and enjoyable and provided the opportunity to network with fellow students. Handling the digital devices gained her valuable 21st century skills and encouraged her to set her sights high! After high school, she returned to pursue a Cisco course. During the pandemic, when her university switched to online learning, she once again found the

KEEPING KIDS IN SCHOOL MAKES LIFE EASIER FOR SINGLE MUMS




With two children in secondary school, life was not easy for Christine. Her kids were often sent home when she fell behind in paying their school fees. But once Elimu removed the burden of school fees from her, she was able to start a small business and earn some extra cash. Now she can manage rent and food and smaller expenses like transport and pocket money for her children. Her daughter, Maryann used to get poor grades due to being sent home from school so frequently, but now she never gets sent home and

her grades have improved. In fact, she is among the top 10 in her class.


Her children are growing in confidence and seeing brighter futures for themselves. But that is not all! 
ELIMU FINANCIAL SUMMARY – YEAR END 2020

Despite the challenges experienced in 2020, revenues to Elimu grew slightly. The team in Kenya kept expenses lower as the year proceeded with uncertainty being the only constant. Generous individuals continued to represent a significant proportion of donations to Elimu in 2020. We are extremely grateful to all of our donors who remained with us during this most challenging pandemic period. We received additional foundation grants in 2020 which helped us to quickly respond to the special needs experienced by our children and their families. We are especially grateful to all of those who allowed us to transfer funds from one area, such as school fees which were not used in 2020, towards other activities such as emergency food assistance and the development of our Offline eLearning Innovation.
